IV, 5 <sup>שקלים</sup> greatly damaged on the inner lower margin; the second contains Ktuboth XI, 6 to end, Ndarim Gittin up to VII, 4; the Mishnah is mostly vocalised; occasionally a few words are left unvoeled.
